



ACUNS DISSERTATION AWARD PROGRAM 2008 – 2009

About the Award

A US\$1,000 dissertation award for candidates at the Ph.D., J.S.D. or LL.M. level who are engaged in the writing stage of their program. The award is intended to highlight the selected recipient as one who combines both innovation and excellence in their work, and thereby to serve as a catalyst for wider attention. The individual may be from any recognized accredited university, and the award may be spent however the recipient deems most valuable to the pursuit of his/her work. The recipient also will be encouraged to submit some written product to *Global Governance*, though use of any materials remains under the direction of the journal editorial team.

As part of its mandate to foster innovation and excellence in research and writing about the United Nations, the U.N. system and the field of international organizations studies, ACUNS established a new Dissertation Award program beginning in 2007. The award can be used in conjunction with other scholarships and fellowships. Applicants must be, or must become, members of ACUNS to be considered for the Dissertation Award.

Candidates for the Award would be from fields of political science, international relations or international law, but other individuals are encouraged to apply; for example, anthropologists working on ethnic conflict and the role of the UN or other international organizations and institutions in conflict resolution and peace-building, or environmental scientists studying international environmental accords and politics. *The central consideration for the award is not simply the substance of a particular global problem, nor the individual applicant's disciplinary background, but rather the clear demonstration of a direct link to institutional issues of the United Nations system.*

A completed application will include three copies of each of the following: (a) not more than a one-thousand-word description of the applicant's dissertation research proposal; (b) curriculum vitae; and (c) two letters of recommendation, including one letter from the applicant's doctoral mentor or a faculty member who knows her/his work. One completed Award application form also must accompany the application.

Forms may be obtained online at www.acuns.org, or from the ACUNS Secretariat. It is the sole responsibility of the applicant to ensure that her/his dossier is complete by the application deadline. All applications must be received by the Secretariat on or before Friday, 14 March 2008. The ACUNS Secretariat will review the

applications for completeness before sending them on to the Selection Committee for consideration. Applicants will be notified on the Committee's decision by the end of April/early May. Details of the winning research project will be announced also at the ACUNS Annual Meeting, 5-7 June 2008. The Award fund will be disbursed following the Annual Meeting.
